

PUNJAB URBAN LAND SYSTEMS ENHANCEMENT PROJECT (PULSE)

Government of the Punjab, Board of Revenue in collaboration with World Bank Group (WBG) is implementing Punjab Urban Land Systems Enhancement Project (PULSE). The project aims to support the Government of Punjab with: (i) improved land records; (ii) identification of land for development, including land for housing programs, and (iii) immediate and effective response in case of an eligible crisis or emergency. Total cost of the Project is EUR 132.6 Million. The project became effective on October 06, 2022.

Project has following five (5) components:

Component 1: Digital Land Records and Cadastral Maps for LRMIS:

Component 2: Land for Housing

Component 3: Integrated Land and Geospatial Information Systems and Services

Component 4: Project Management and Institutional Strengthening

Component 5: Contingent Emergency Response Component

Major Achievements to date

- Drone Imagery and satellite imagery of Hafizabad, Lodhran Completed.
- Digitization of Sahiwal map is also completed and creating digital parcel maps of the Sahiwal division along with the continuation of the partition of land (wandajat) is in process.
- Archiving & Indexing of Old Registered Deeds 95% completed as 151 million pages of 17.80 million deeds have been scanned and digitally archived.
- Digitization of remaining manual mauzas completion is also at an advance stage as 99.99% of the mauzas records. Scanned, 5949 scanned, data entry of 1071 and 201 notified to go live.
- Scanning of old Mussavie Maps have been at an advance stage as 60,307+ mussavies (revenue maps) have been recovered/scanned and organized/digitized by PULSE
- The parcel mapping activity in 3 pilot districts followed by 17 new districts is underway.
- 1000/out Of 1996 geodetic monuments/Burjis/Tri junction monuments built across 15 districts of the Punjab.
- 1896/out Of 1996 Installation of Geodetic Monuments in Punjab across 38 districts of the Punjab.
- 701/ out of 1996 GNSS Readings of Geodetic Monuments in Punjab across 17 districts of the Punjab.
- Integration of Eight Housing Authorities (including Cooperatives, PHATA, LDA, GDA, RDA, MDA, BDA, FDA, SDA) by digitally Mapping 836 Housing Societies with attributes having **874,614** Parcels achieved so far under the component to achieve an integrated and unified land management system in place under PULSE.
- Scanning of 120/ out of 171 Cooperative Housing Societies have been completed and data entry of 25/ out of 171 Cooperative Housing Societies completed.
